

MESSAGE FROM THE OUT GOING PRESIDENT

The 2004/2005 WABL Board performed fantastic things for our kids this year. The board worked hard to obtain and secure grants, donations, gifts, and equipment to better the program. A grant was obtained for approximately \$27,000 from the City of Akron to complete the Shatto benches, fence, and construction of a new batting cage for our kids. We obtained an additional \$5,000 from a benefactor to purchase pitching machines for both the boys and girls along with the accessories.

This could not have happened without the Board, the City of Akron Engineers, the City of Parks and Recreation, the City Service Director, and our Councilman – Bob Keith. We obtained a grant to receive 60 new batting helmets with face guards from the Ohio Ophthalmoligical Society valued

at \$35 per helmet. Please thank Dave Celik and his committee for working on this project over the past two years. We worked with Hot Stove to create a partnership to help our F League boys. Tim Campbell was instrumental in getting this project done.

Members repaired and painted the storage boxes and obtained dirt. Please also thank the Firestone Band, the Firestone Baseball Team for concessions, APD, AFD, all our sponsors, the Aeros, the Racers, and most importantly the Board, coaches, and all behind the scenes for doing such a great job!

2005 F League Review

Last year, WABL's four F-League (13-14) teams played in the North Akron Chapter of Ohio Hot Stove. Some call it travel ball without the travel. Although very good, all of the teams are roster, not travel teams. One of WABL's teams (Royals) finished at .500. The Tigers were not far behind. The Reds and Yankees didn't do so well. However, both the Tigers and Yankees won their semi-final WABL playoff games, and participated in a well-played, hard fought, exciting championship game which was won by the Yankees. The Tigers had two men on base in the 7th inning which ended when their batter hit a "rocket" to the Yankees second baseman who turned it into the 3rd and final out of the game.

WABL is going to continue it's F-League affiliation with Ohio Hot Stove Baseball again this year. However, changes are in the works. Most of the Hot Stove teams (from North Akron, Stow, Hudson, Mogadore, and Goodyear Heights) are mostly13-yearold or 14-year-old teams. Last year's WABL teams were, as usual,

a combination of 13 and 14-years-olds. This year we are in the process of working out a procedure to field teams which are primarily made up of either 13 or 14-year-olds.

Yet, the best thing about Hot Stove is that it is an all-inclusive, roster team league. As such, Ohio Hot Stove Baseball is philosophically very close to that of the average recreational league. As our players get older, the better ones end up playing high school baseball and beyond. Participation drops off because most players don't have anywhere to play. WABL's F-League (and this year EE-League affiliation) rectifies that situation.
