2007 EE-LEAGUE REPORT

In 2007, WABL expanded it's affiliation with the North Akron Chapter of Ohio Hot Stove Baseball by sponsoring two EE-League teams for the first time. The North Akron Chapter of Ohio Hot Stove consists of teams or 15 and 16 year olds from northeastern Ohio, including the communities of North Akron, Ellet, Ravenna, Springfield, Mogadore, Crestwood, Aurora, and Kenmore. The games are played on full-size fields such as Summit Lake Park, and require the use of -3 bats (Ohio High School Athletic Association standard). Last season, one of WABL's two teams was made up almost exclusively of Firestone High School freshmen and sophomores. This year's EE-League teams were the Greens, managed by Tim Campbell, and the Falcons, managed by Chris Fuller.

This year, with the cooperation of Firestone High School, we are working on arrangements for the EE-League home games to be played at the brand new Firestone High School baseball field. Ohio Hot Stove EE-League does not start until after school ends in June, yet completes a busy 18-20 game season by mid-July.
